Public Input -

Rich Marett, Candidate for Huron County Commissioner

Mr Marett (R) is running for Huron County Commissioner and wanted to take this opportunity to introduce himself. He is a lifelong resident of Huron County and has been serving as a Trustee for 20 years. He is also the Vice President of the Huron County Township Association and serves on the Huron County Fair Board. Marett recognizes that Plymouth, being at the southern most part of the county, doesn't always get a "fair shake" and would like to remedy that. He believes himself able to fairly represent everyone in the county, not just the people of Norwalk. He invites anyone to contact him if they have any questions.

Rob Skinner, North Coast Wireless

Mr. Skinner is here representing North Coast Wireless Communications. NCWCOM is a local fiber and wireless internet provider based out of Wellington, Ohio. They have a total of 56 towers in 11 counties. There is currently a tower on Bowman St and one in New Haven. NCWCOM was awarded a House Bill 2 Residential Broadband Expansion Grant, meaning they have committed to constructing broadband fiber internet infrastructure allowing accessibility to 324 addresses in Huron County.

Mayor Fryman stated she would love to meet with Mr. Skinner about expanding fiber optic coverage into the Village of Plymouth. Skinner also distributed a scholarship application for a high school graduating senior that lives in a household with NCWCOM internet service. They must be pursuing a certificate program or degree in a qualified program. The list is available on their website. He apologizes for the late notice, stating the application is due March 1, 2024.
