Issues discussed:

**Pool**

- Piping short for the filters
- Looked at fencing to repair
- Hoping to have pool open on the 19th.
- Once the plumbing for the filters is complete we need to do the following:
  - Wait 24 hours for it to cure
  - Atleast one day to fill the pool
  - Add chemicals and test.
- Advertising was discussed. We are waiting until we get the supplies. We will know more then. The hope is to open on the 18<sup>th</sup> or 19<sup>th</sup> of June.
- It was suggested to see if there is a way we could open on the weekends in August.
- Currecnt status on guards is two for sure.
- Discussion took place on Council helping out in the concession
- If there is guard staffing issues maybe only open certain days per week or a shortened time period.

**Park**

The following items need repaired:

- Scout Hut needs gutters repaired and cleaned
  - Would like to update the inside
    - Install a sink and small countertops
    - Update bathroom
    - Update appliances
    - Paint floors and walls
- Fencing by the tennis courts
- Repair or replace two swings on the swing set.
- Clean off the roofs of the pavilions

Starting Tuesday the 14<sup>th</sup> Christy Lane Industries will be at the Park helping clean up twigs and bagging leaves.

**Various**

Mrs. Moore thanked the Administrator for getting the weeds around the chapel removed. She wondered if it would be possible to remove a few more branches off the crabapple tree.

The sidewalk on the corner of Sandusky and Brazillian Street needs to be replaced from work being done by Village.

The Vac truck needs to be on the streets checking the catch basins and cleaning them out.

Gutters on the Firehouse need to be repaired and cleaned out. Once they are cleaned and repaired they should be cleaned out regularly. Councilman Cassidy to get with the Fire Chief.

Trees by the gazebo need to be cleaned up around the base. There are small shoots growing.

Also are people allowed to play music in the gazebo? Discussion took place. If it is going to be a continuous occurrence maybe the Gazebo should be moved across the street by the Pioneer Rest Cemetery.

**Village Dump**

Discussion took place on the dump being locked. It used to be locked all the time and residents had to pick up the key and go to the Village before dumping brush to verify they were not dumping other items. It has been being left open because a lot of residents clean up their yards on the weekend and do not have access to the key.

It was stated they would like to see the dump locked again. And residents can pick up a key on Friday. Mrs. Root suggested to have a notice put on the Web page, facebook and utility bills that only yard waste can be taken to the dump.

It was asked how to keep the grass trimmed in the area where the solar panels are located. It was stated there is a special type of grass planted.

**Zoning Inspector**

Discussion took place on hours of work. They would like to see him here for a few hours during the week. Maybe have a day with set office hours so that residents needing permits can come in on those days.

Mayor Fryman will talk with him.

**Food Trucks**

Mr. Patrick stated at the beginning of the year he got a list of the events going on uptown in connection with food trucks. It was changed from Friday to Saturday. Arrangements were made to have them on the south west side of West Broadway. He was concerned with vendors being in the triangle. He is bringing it up because he has had complaints. He stated arrangements were made so that they would be on West Broadway or behind the building where the museum was or in Ohio eye parking lot. Also the Hound Dog hop is not happy about the food trucks.


Discussion took place on various items including asking if Spring Street could be closed. Other items discussed were as follows:

- It's not Council's job to prevent competition
- We need people in the downtown to encourage growth.
- The food trucks show activity, things going on.
- The previous agreement was made to make other businesses happy and we need to think about the existing businesses.

Mr. Cassidy feels this should go to Zoning to create a space for these kinds of items. That way there is a specific and permanent location.

Ohio Eye gave permission for self-contained food trucks and vendors.
