Motion re: Navitas

This is legislation settling with Navitas Corporation. It was noted the Mayor's name needed changed on the legislation.

Resolution re: Transfer of deed and ownership

This motion was to accept the transfer of deed and property of 26 Trux Street/20 N. Main St.

Mr. Patrick asked about the property owned by the bar. Mayor Fryman stated the lot had already been split.

Ordinance re: regulations and permitting the operation of low speed vehicles

This will be the third and final reading. 4a was left as is. 6k was added – seatbelts. Chief Hintz stated right now they cannot be driven in the 45mph zone. It conflicts with State law. He also stated this will need to be amended when the State law changes.

Discussion took place on the 45mph speed limit in front of Mack's and Dollar General.

Ordinance re: Second round of small business grants

Mayor Fryman stated the Richland Chamber is doing another round of small business grants. Some of the guidelines to request funding have changed to allow more businesses to apply. If funding was received in the first round, they cannot apply for the second round.


Discussion took place on cares fund and small business grants.
