John Courtney presented information regarding behind-the-meter generator policy.

BPM generation is behind the meter. Customers are looking into adding solar power to their homes. This is more about the customer side. By adding solar power it causes a reduction in energy sales and reduces revenues and transmission.


The Village needs to develop a policy. He recommended the following:

1. Limit the size of the BTM generator to Customer's Peak demand
2. Limit the total aggregate amount of BTM generation to not more than 5% of the Village's total energy requirement.
3. Implement a net billing arrangement.
4. Modify existing electric rate schedules and adopt a small power producer rate for surplus energy.
5. Require customer to submit an application for interconnection and execute an interconnection agreement, similar to those provided by AMP, prior to installing the BTM Generator.

Discussion took place on charging for the special meter. Mr. Courtney stated most charge for this cost upfront.

Discussion took place on putting a limit on the amount of credit to make it equal to the cost of the electric bill is. In addition, not to include water and sewer.

Mr. Courtney will send The Administrator the information to help adopt a policy. The Administrator felt this was a good idea because he has had several inquiries. It would be good to have a policy in place before residents start to use solar power.
