Public Input - Greg Stewart, 94 West Broadway, Plymouth

Mr. Stewart came to ask two things for council to consider. 1.) Legislation to limit the number of dogs per household was removed from the codified ordinances. He is requesting it be put back in. The resident at 98 West Broadway has 16-20 dogs. Mayor Fryman stated we have a nuisance ordinance that should take care of the problem. Mr. Stewart stated he would like to see the ordinance enforced.

2) The outbuilding (garage) at 98 West Broadway is leaning towards his garage. He would like it inspected. His concern is it is going to collapse onto his garage.

Moore asked if the dogs are well cared for. Stewart stated he could not say. They do receive chewy orders. They only bring out 4-8 dogs out at a time. He stated he and his wife have counted as many as 20 dogs.

Committee Reports –

Finance: Mrs. Clark stated the Auditor's are on site performing the 2023-2024 audit.

Service: Mr. Hurles stated the Administrator handed out a detailed report. If anyone has any questions, the Administrator can answer any questions. Mr. Cassidy asked if the basketball court was lined yet. Burton stated no he has not yet had a chance.

- Finished up the electric for the fire department.

Safety: Mr. Cassidy asked how the station was moving along. Chief Metzger stated they are continuing to work on the heating and cooling, and plumbing. Most of the doors are in, doing more concrete work. The ambulance is still on schedule for February.

Broderick asked if the Association is sending out new letters letting everyone know about what is going on and what is still needed. Metzger stated yes.

Rules and Village Admin: Mrs. Moore nothing to consider tonight.

Planning Commission: Mr. Brown stated zoning meet to discuss the fence variance for 64 Mulberry. Planning commission allowed the variance.

Pool/Park: Ms. Broderick stated the pool is currently leaking. They are working with Ross and will be using ground penetrating radar to look for the leak. It may determine when we open, possibly Friday. Mayor Fryman asked if we have used ground penetrating radar before. It was stated no. It was also stated the leak is about 2 feet down, below the jets. Mr. Brown asked to be notified when we find out.

Economic Development: Mrs. Moore stated there will be an economic development meeting on June 17, 2025 at 7pm.

Announcements: Next Council meeting will be June 10, 2025. Committees to meet as needed.


