Review of Legislation

Council met in committee to review the legislation for the meeting tonight.

Resolution for Village Police Crusier.

This is the third and final reading on a Resolution for the repalcement of the Chevy Carprice Police crusier. Since this was an emergency Resolution it will be effective immediately after passage.

Resolution for CoronaVirus


This Resolution is step one that needs to be completed to be eligible for relief funding from the State of Ohio. This relief fund is only for Local Governments who have not received direct funding from the Federal Government. The relief funding is distributed based on funding from the 2019 level of Local Government distribution. It should be around 100 – 110% of the amount received in 2019. The Fiscal Officer will also need to register the Village with the Office of Budget and Management(OBM) and attend a virtual training. The 2019 amount received from local government was \$ 51,960.13

Discussion – questions were asked what this would reimburse for. It was stated at the moment some items were still a little grey but it would cover the cost of cleaning supplies along with other items.

Ordinance to remove fines and cost for minor marijuana violations

This Resolution is to change the penalty cost and fines for obtaining, possessing, cultivating, gifting, selling, and manufacturing marijuana or using marijuana paraphernalia to \$0.00, if it is under two hundred grams. It does not change the minor misdemeanor drug offense charge. Due to the cost of evidentiary testing requirements for the determination of marijuana THC or CBD .

Discussion took place on what this actually does. It does not remove the minor misdemeanor it just removes the fine. Chief Hintz was asked how many citations have been issued in the last year. Chief Hintz stated none under the 200 grams. It would not be cost effective due to testing.
