VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH Service Committee Minutes

September 20, 2023

Service Committee on September 20, 2023, at 6:30pm.

The following were present:

Committee Members: Mayor Fryman, Mrs. Carter, Mrs. Clark and Ms. Broderick.

Employees and other Councilmembers: DiAnn Jamerson, Fiscal Officer; James Burton, Administrator.

Visitors: None

Mrs. Carter started the meeting with the following:

Streets/Utilities

West Broadway Street

Carter seen the pictures Rebekah sent. She stated this is not a Village problem. The Village should probably contact the land owner to update their drainage.

Another Solution would be to increase the sewer line in that area.

Mrs. Clark stated she had been talking to the Richland county road department and high water always comes with a hard and heavy rain. We don't get storms like that all the time.

The biggest read flag is when there are high water areas multiple times a year with a normal rain not just the down pours and severe storms.

Administrator Burton stated the problem is the heavy rain. He agreed we could increase the pipe size but unless the land owner does something it may still be a problem.

Carter asked if Burton spoke with Cody about the concern.

Burton stated he spoke with Cody about the removal of the lead lines. They will be starting them soon. But he did talk to Tyler and he did say we would not be getting into the roads if we wanted to increase the line for the storm water. Those lines are on top of the water lines and they are not in the road but beside it.

New OPWC Grant (Plymouth East Road)

- There were no new updates on the grant.
- Fryman stated the update of the hearing with ODOT.
 - They went a half hour over their presentation time.
 - Will know something by November at the latest.
 - Neither county wants the bridge
 - There is a big question on ownership
 - The time line would be begin engineering and design takes one year.
 - Most likely spring of 2026 but could be sooner.
 - They also discussed a jump bridge – this is a ramp over an existing bridge this would be to open it sooner while we wait for repairs.

Pool/Park

Pool & Splash Pad

- Everything winterized and put away for winter?
 - Burton stated the pool is

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- Broderick asked if the lines have been blown out. Stating they had to be blown out.
- Burton asked if the buckets needed to be taken down
 - Broderick to check with Raindrop
- Burton stated everything will be winterized after flag football.
- Burton gave an update on the booster station
 - Will start work on it in October
 - Everything is in
- Burton also stated the chapel is complete with the repairs
- Would still like to scrap and paint the outside
- Broderick asked what they did
 - Burton stated they fixed the porch and replaced the ceiling
- Burton is waiting on a quote for the mausoleum
 - The inside ceiling is falling apart

Scout Hut

- Burton stated he is waiting on a quote

Basketball Court & Grant

- Discussion on basketball court quotes from 7 L, Precision, A1, and Thompson
- 7L: total cost \$33,500
- Includes everything from material, site work, grading, cleanup, and striping. Village would have to do no work themselves.
- Precision: total cost \$34,956
- Includes everything from material, site work, grading, and cleanup. Village would have to do striping. Also does not include a virgin asphalt mix.
Contractor said to factor an extra \$220-\$308 making a total of \$35,264
- A1 : total cost is around 35,000
 - I do not have the specifics someone at the meeting took the quote I passed around
- Discussion took place on changing the scope of the grant to do something for the Flag Football league
 - Mayor was contacted by Matt Blankenship about lights so they could play longer
 - Also discussed bleachers and possibly fixing the concession stand.
 - Carter asked if anyone was interested in changing the scope
 - Broderick voice concerns about changing the scope and felt it had to be new construction
 - Carter stated she email Theresa and the scope could be changed
 - Additional discussion took place
 - Mayor stated we might be able to maximize the field with funding from another source.
 - They would need to get some answers to questions first such as:
 - How many lights
 - The continuity of the flag football league.
 - How many bleachers
 - Broderick stated a lot of kids play basketball on the tennis court.
 - Broderick stated Patrick talked to Thompson re the basketball court and Thompson would include the prep work for the \$23,000
 - Carter stated she would like to stay with in the budget of the grant for \$ 25,000.00
 - Discussion turned to the reno of the scout and how it was going to be done by volunteers
 - Mrs. Clark stated the new basketball court would be about \$ 30,000
 - Someone is to talk to Blankenship and then a decision can be made
- Broderick stated the tennis court needs to be resurfaced and new nets bought.

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Mrs. Clark stated she attended a webinar on economic development but it was actually a service related issue where there is a grant that helps with sidewalks and roads. We would have to partner with another nonprofit group.

Cater will try to find answers to the questions regarding the football field. Once that is accomplished they will make a decision and proceed.


Mayor Fryman will focus on the OPWC grant and reach out to the township.
