Motion re: Substantially Dedicated

This motion is about the CARES funding to name the substantially dedicated employees per the Ohio Budget and Management FAQ's and US Treasury FAQ's. For public safety, and public health employees whose services are substantially dedicated it is presumed for administrative convenience that personnel costs related to these areas are substantially dedicated. A list of employees is attached to the motion.

Motion re: Village Administrator

This motion is to compensate the Village Administrator for his technical services in performing Ohio EPA testing of the Village Public Water quality until a new operator of record is hired.

Resolution re: Amounts and Rates set by Budget Commission

This Resolution is to accept the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies. This is based off our 2021 revenue budget.

Ordinance re: Delete section 52.02 of codified ordinances

This Ordinance is to delete a redundant section of our codified ordinances. The garbage containers were addressed in an amendment in November 2019.

Ordinance re: regulations and permitting the operation of low speed vehicles


This Ordinance is to regulate and permit the operation of low-speed and under-speed vehicles on Village streets and sidewalks. It will be read in three readings to allow comment and discussion. There may need to be a change in section 4 a regarding the inspection by the village Police department. Chief Hintz stated that there was a new Supreme Court ruling regarding this, which will need to be looked into.

Ordinance re: Amend permanent appropriations

This ordinance is to amend the appropriations for the sewer fund to account for the loans/lease proceeds for the Vac-truck.

Other items to consider:
