VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH

Committee before Council

Held April 25, 2023

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The Village of Plymouth convened in Committee on April 25, 2023 at 6:50PM in person. Mayor Fryman called the meeting to order with the following members and visitors present:

Mayor Fryman stated tonight we have a motion, two resolutions and one ordinance to consider.

Before going over legislation for this meeting she wanted to go over a few items.

1. She met with an official from the Ohio Municipal League and they asked if the Village would consider a Resolution in support of urging the Governor and General assembly to restore the Local Government funds to pre-recession levels.
 - Legislation will be prepared for next meeting.
2. An individual is interested in renting the kitchen on a monthly basis. The individual has a bakery license. Their business has grown and needs more counter tops and room to bake her products.
 - Mr. Patrick asked if it would be after hours, if so they will need to come thru the police entrance.
 - Discussion took place on rental fee, and Village would have to be listed as a secondary on their liability insurance.
3. Bridge update – Mayor Fryman stated would have more information after the next Council meeting.
4. Someone is interested in purchasing some parcels of land from the Village. It is the land across from the old water plant. The business would be building a 60x80 building. She would like to do this through the land bank.
 - Council agreed to look into it.
5. Update on the removal of house purchased by the Village. We are on the schedule. There are 13 houses in Willard set for removal, while there they will come over and remove ours.

Mrs. Broderick went over the following legislation:

Motion – Seasonal hire Mike Follett

This is a rehire from last year.

Motion to approve amendment to Transfer Resolution

This motion is to make a correction on the transfer resolution that will have its second reading tonight. Discussion took place that the amendment did not remove the wording “as necessary”.

The Fiscal Officer stated she along with Councilwoman Broderick and Rebekah Fearing received the amended legislation from the Solicitor while she was out of town last week. Legislation was sent out on Monday (yesterday) and she asked if there were any questions, problems or corrections to contact her before the meeting and items would be corrected. She also pointed out that she had not heard from anyone prior to the council meeting about the issue and did not know what the revision was to include. Ms. Broderick asked for the revision and

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received the legislation last week and no additional revisions were received and no one contacted her. She did not know of any further issues. Furthermore, she stated to continue this discussion any further was not necessary we have been working on this for over a month, and felt it was disrespectful to keep rehashing and not notifying her of an additional correction prior to the meeting and then to sit and further discuss the same changes that needed made. Mr. Hurles interjected that she was correct.

The Fiscal Officer asked what changes they wanted and that it could be put in the motion to amend for the second reading, and they could waive the suspension of rules and pass the resolution tonight.

They asked that the wording of "as necessary" be removed from the legislation. The Fiscal Officer stated she would make the amended corrections after the meeting and verify that everything was corrected as they wanted before signing the legislation.

Committee adjourned at 7:10PM.
