Committee before Council

Held May 23, 2023

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The Village of Plymouth convened in Committee on May 23, 2023 at 6:31PM in person. Mayor Fryman called the meeting to order with the following members and visitors present:

Mayor Fryman stated due to absent members tonight we will only be able to present three motions tonight. There are housekeeping matters, and will be reviewed briefly.

Motion – Korry King Full time utility worker
Administrator Burton explained his prior work history

Motion – Pool employee wages
Mr. Patrick wanted to know why the Manager and Assistant Manager get higher raises.
Mrs. Moore stated that it was due to experience and qualifications. Patrick again asked why the Assistant manager got \$1.50 raise.
Ms. Broderick stated she would like the pool/park committee to meet.
Mr. Hurles asked why they had not called a pool/park committee. Patrick responded he stayed out of it because of ethics. Broderick responded she was told to stay out of it.

Talk of the Town was brought up. Discussion took place on Brylie's Post. Hurles commented that Brylie should not have made the comment on Facebook – Talk of the town.

Discussion took place on the hiring.

Additional discussion took place on the Manager and Assistant Manager.
Patrick stated he stayed out of this, he further went on to add he had this all worked out six weeks prior.

Discussion took place on if the manager and assistant manager should have life guard certification. Outcome was it is highly recommended but not required.

Resolution A – Restore Local Government Funds
To urge the legislators to restore local government to pre-recession levels.

Resolution B – Fire Levy – Renewal
Renewal levy for the Fire department.

Resolution C – Park Levy – Additional
New levy for parks and recreation to help fund the pool.

Resolution D – Create position Building/Grounds Maintenance Assistance
To combine the position of park care taker and custodian.

Gretchen Fullard spoke on the combination of the duties. Fullard stated it felt like a slap in the face to be given more duties and responsibilities for the dollar increase.

Patrick asked what is the starting pay of a full-time utility worker? It was stated \$16.50.

Moore suggested to discuss it in executive session prior to vote.

Motion – Set rate for grounds maintenance assistant

Resolution E – Cooperative for Fire Suppression
Two-year renewal agreement with ODNR. Housekeeping

Resolution F – Huron County EMA agreement
Annual Huron County Emergency Management Agency agreement.

Committee adjourned at 7:11pm.


