The Village of Plymouth convened in Committee on June 13, 2023 at 6:49PM in person. Mayor Fryman called the meeting to order with the following members and visitors present:

Mayor Fryman presented the following legislation to be considered:

**Motion** – Appointment of Marc Rodriguez

This motion is to confirm the Mayor's appointment of Marc Rodriguez as a part-time police officer. No discussion was heard.

**Motion** – Pool Employee Wages

This motion is to provide compensation and set wages for current and former Village pool employees. Ms. Broderick stated she disagreed on paying Addison Cushing for her time worked as Assistant Manager. She said this was never presented to Council for approval. Administrator Burton says there was no time to bring to Council, because the person who he intended to hire as the Assistant declined the job last minute. In order to have the appropriate staff available to work, he chose to appoint Addi since she had the most seniority.

Ms. Broderick again stated her disapproval of the motion. Jamerson pointed out both Addi (as Assistant Manager) and Katelyn (as Lifeguard) have since resigned their positions, so it would only mean compensating them for the limited time they worked.

Jamerson also stated she spoke with Solicitor Burton, and he advised we pay these appropriate wages for the jobs that were performed.

**Resolution A** – Restore Local Government Funds

The premise of this resolution is to urge the legislators to restore local government to pre-recession levels. No additional discussion was heard.

Mayor Fryman stated the next two resolutions are the second set of necessary legislation to proceed with getting a levy on the ballot.

**Resolution B** – Fire Levy – Renewal

This is a renewal levy for the Fire Department.

**Resolution C** – Park Levy – Additional

This is a new levy for parks and registration. It was asked for the Mayor to make clear in the Council meeting, this levy will be used for pool operations only.

**Ordinance A-** Amend Appropriations- Ordinance 3-2023

Mayor Fryman asked Jamerson to explain why the permanent appropriations were being amended. Jamerson stated, after speaking with Rebekah, she feels it safe to increase the expected revenue levels for the pool concession and admission. This will provide the pool with the additional funds needs to continue operation until she (Jamerson) is able to complete the requested spreadsheets outlinging the pool fund incoming and outgoing monies.

Jamerson went on to say Council may have to consider using more ARPA money to cover pool operations. She stated there was a lot of purchasing done in April and May.

Mrs. Moore, being head of the Finance Committee, asked Jamerson if they should meet to discuss these items. It was decided to meet Monday, June 26<sup>th</sup> at 5:30PM.
