Committee Meeting before Council

Held February 11, 2020

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The Village of Plymouth convened in committee meetings on February 11, 2020 at 48 West Broadway Plymouth, Ohio 44865, at 6:37pm. Members and visitors present:

Review of Legislation

Animal Ordinance - Mrs. Root stated it will have the third and final reading tonight. She believes it to be “just right”, Chief Hintz agrees.

MESA Circuit Rider - Mrs. Root asked Administrator Rusynyk to summarize this for Council. Rusynyk says this circuit rider will provide supplemental support and training opportunities. He explains that right now we depend on Shelby and AMP for mutual aid; neither are free. Municipal Energy Services Agency (MESA) asks the Village to provide a “good faith” estimate for the amount of time we presume to need for the year; however, we only pay for time actually used. Rusynyk expects us to still utilize Shelby in case of emergencies, saying they will be much quicker to respond over MESA who would be coming from Columbus. In addition to support, both Jarred Hintz and Darren Elliot will be able to earn credit hours towards their lineman training.

Rusynyk also wanted to clarify to Council that when he asked Jon Burton to draw up this legislation he did not specifically ask for it to be done as an emergency. He wanted to know Council’s opinion. Councilwoman Moore feels this is something that should be put in place as soon as possible. Councilwoman Root states the legislation should remain worded as written.


Motion on wages - This is being re-done to fix a clerical error.

Utility On-Call Schedule - Administrator Rusynyk asked if Council would like a copy of the utility worker’s on-call schedule. No one felt this was necessary at this time.

Squad Minimum Call-Out - Councilwoman Root wanted to clarify the minimum 3 hour call-out only pertains to transporting persons on squad calls. This does not affect fire personnel.

Council Sub-Committees – Mayor Fryman went over changes made to the committees. Councilman Patrick expressed his reservations about being on Finance Committee. Fryman said she was very deliberate about the placements she made; committees stand.

Pool 2020 Season – Councilwoman Moore asked Council before any decisions are made about the 2020 pool season that PIC would like to meet with Council. It was suggested to invite PIC to the Rules and Finance meeting on February 20, 2020 at 1pm.
