Ms. Broderick stated there are 3 Motions, 2 Resolution and 1 Ordinance to on the agenda tonight.

**Motion: J. Fidler CDL pay increase**

This is to compensate for Jacob obtaining his CDL license.

**Motion: Confirmation of Follett and Adams as seasonal maintenance**

This is to approve and set the rate for the seasonal employees.

**Motion: Authorize payment for lifeguard class**

This is to authorize and direct the Fiscal Officer to pay the Mansfield YMCA or Norwalk Recreation center or any other company offering lifeguard class for up to (5) Five applicants, if there is a need.

**Resolution re: ODOT chip and seal**

This resolution allows ODOT to chip and seal certain sections of 603 within the Village.

**Resolution re: Park and Recreation Levy**

This would place a new levy on the ballot for parks and recreation to help with the operations of the pool.

It would bring in approximately \$20,000.00 per year. The cost would be (.10) ten cents per \$100.00 of the assessed value of the home.

**Ordinance re: Amend permanent appropriations**

This is to amend the permanent appropriations for the donation to pay for the lounge chairs, picnic tables, and trash cans at the pool.

Discussion took place on the buildings for sale on the square.

Discussion also took place on 38 West Broadway next to the Village building. It was stated an under-ground gas tank was found and the EPA was contacted.

Also discussed was 34 W. Broadway. Paperwork was submitted to demolish the house. Huron County Land reutilization Corp. will receive the funds in the summer. It is their hope that it will be down by the end of summer.
