

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH
Committee Meeting before Council

Held August 29, 2022

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The Village of Plymouth convened in committee meeting on August 29, 2022 at 48 West Broadway Plymouth, Ohio 44865, at 6:45pm. Members and visitors present:

Ms. Broderick stated there were 2 Motions, 3 Resolutions and 1 Ordinance to consider.

Mrs. Moore thanked the Utility guys for the nice patch job on St. Rt. 61.

Ms. Broderick asked about the water at the corner of Dix St. and St. Rt. 61. Administrator Burton stated it is an old hydrant and it is being closed slowly from when the utility guys flushed the hydrants. There is grit or sediment in the valve and needs to be done slowly.

Administrator Burton stated the new hire called him Sunday evening stating the job offer he had been waiting on for some time happened. He was offered \$25.00/hr. The Administrator will be contacting the next person in line to see if they are interested. If he is he will be sent for a background check.

Mayor Fryman went over the legislation.

Motion - to accept resignations of employees Liggett and Mireles.

Mayor Fryman stated this is just a formality. Mr. Liggett resigned/retired on August 22, 2022. Mr. Mireles resigned on August 28, 2022.

Motion – to confirm new Fire/Emt

Terry was recommended by Chief Metzger. This is also pending background check, Drug test and Physical.

Ordinance – Amend 7-2022 permanent appropriations.

The Fiscal Officer stated changes were made to the Park fund due to a donation. This donation purchased 2 additional picnic tables. The Opioid OneOhio fund was created due to the settlement the Attorney General filed and funds were received. Council/Rules committee along with the Police Chief will need to set the rules on how this money will be spent to offset the Opioid crisis. The ARPA fund was amended because of an additional small distribution. The General fund was revised because there were some line items that could not be funded or fully funded until additional money was received. She stated we need to be careful of spending in the general fund so that we have an adequate carry over. A finance meeting should probably be held.

Resolution – Dump truck

Mayor Fryman stated this is being done because the prior truck that has been on order is now cancelled. The bid was won by Nick Mayer in early 2021. It was for a 2022 Ford super duty with an 11' steel dump bed and 9' plow. There is still no production date. Tim Lally has a 2022 Chevy Silverado 4wd in stock with an 11' steel dump bed. There was no plow quoted with it. But since we are still down 1 dump and this was available the Administrator thought to proceed.

Mr. Patrick asked about the truck from Tim Lally. He thought they were going to try to purchase a truck that had an Aluminum bed so that it did not rust out. He also thought they were thinking of getting a 10' plow.

Discussion took place on the type of bed and the plow and the plow size.

Concerns were heard regarding buying an additional dump truck with a park levy on the ballot.

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Mr. Hurles stated we need to communicate with the residents on the things going on in town.

It was stated the second truck is to replace the order that was cancelled.

Additional discussion took place on the second dump truck. Some felt one dump was enough. Administrator Burton voiced concerns with only having one.

Resolution- Contract with M.O.M.

Mayor Fryman stated our contract is up with Perry soon and we have an opportunity to save additional money and obtain faster copier/printers with this company.

Resolution – ODOT

Mayor Fryman stated this is a housekeeping matter for the Crosswalk project.

Committee adjourned at 7:11pm
