Water / Sewer

- Installing the UV lights at the sewer plant.

Electric

- Cut across the road for Plymouth township.

Pool / Cemetery / Park

- Got the water back on at the park restrooms.
- Remove the picnic tables from the pool.
- Cleaning the park up.
- One cremation and one full grave.
- Working on the pool.

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- Laid out nine footer frames at the cemetery.
- Hanging new lights in the pump room for the pool.
- Making calls to find a drain cover for the pool.
- Painting the restrooms in the park.

Misc

- Rereads for water and electric.
- Mowing out at our garage and around the sewer plant.
- Mowing the town.
- AEP had the power out approximately 3 to 5 hours due to accident.
- Took the new dump truck to Wilmington to get the hood cylinder replaced.
- Cleaning garage.

Administrator Burton also handed out a to do list of things the guys are working on. The list was made up by him and the utility guys.

It was stated Saturday is clean up day at the pool

Ms. Broderick asked if planters could be put were the trees were cut down on the square.

It was stated there are plans to add something there.

Administrator Burton stated the guys have a lot going on with Cemetery clean up, mowing the town, getting the pool and park ready, they do not have a lot of extra time right now.

Administrator Burton also stated he spoke with Jason at KEM, who talked with ODOT. The problem is the base of the road. Unfortunately, the base is the responsibility of the Village. The cost will be on the Village. In the meantime, a rough road sign has been placed near the dip.
