Service – Mr. Patrick stated everyone has Administrator Burton's report it was as follows:

Mayor Fryman thanked the utility workers as well as AMP for assistance during the power outage.

Mrs. Carter had comments and questions over various items. Wondered why the drain at the pool in the now expanded grass area was cracked and dirt was in the drain. She also questioned why somethings are not being done.

It was stated the Administrator is aware and these questions would be best asked to the Administrator.

Ms. Broderick asked about the lights uptown. It was stated the line was possibly hit when Mid-Ohio pipeline was working on that area. It might need a whole new line.

Safety – Mr. Brown read the fire/ems report for May. It was as follows:

The Police department had 299 calls for May.

It was stated the fireworks law is about to change. If we do not enact our own ordinance, we will fall under the state law and will not be able to make any changes. Chief Hintz stated in his opinion it would be best for the Village to pass an ordinance. The state law allows 15 days.

Discussion took place.

Chief Metzger stated without an ordinance of our own there is a safety concern.

Rules and Village Administration – Ms. Broderick stated there is one resolution and 2 motions to consider tonight.

Planning Commission – No report.

Economic Development - Mrs. Moore stated nothing to report at this time.

Pool and Park Committee

Ms. Broderick had the following report:

Pool

- Waiting for the electric to be hooked up.
- Waiting on State inspection.
- We have 3 guards and a manager.
- Concession stand is ready, and food has been ordered.
- Manager has been busy getting things set up and ready.
- Pool hours will be noon to 7pm daily. Pool parties are 7pm to 9pm.2
- Still trying to paint and new furniture is on it's way.

It was asked if a 16-year-old could be the assistant manager. Ms. Broderick will check on this.

It was stated the bathrooms will be completed after the season.

MAYOR FRYMAN READ A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY AN ADDITIONAL 1.0 MILL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARKS AND RECREATION IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. [R.C. 5705.19(H)]

It was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Patrick to suspend the rules.

Votes were Mrs. Hannah Carter, Aye; Mrs. Susan Moore, Abstain; Mr. Matthew Patrick, Aye; Mr. Jeff Brown, Aye; Mr. Rich Hurlles, Absent and Ms. Susan Broderick, Aye

Motion carries 4 yeas, 0 nays, 1 abstain.

Mayor Fryman stated this was a new levy for parks and recreation. The cost to the homeowner is .10(10 cents) per \$100.00 of assessed value.

Mrs. Moore stated her abstaining is not because she disapproves of the levy.

Ms. Broderick stated she has spoke with some residents that did not understand the funding situation of the pool. She felt if it was explained one on one it would be helpful.

It was moved by Ms. Broderick and seconded by Mr. Brown to accept on the third and final reading.


