

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH Service Committee

Held May 7, 2024

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The Village of Plymouth convened in Service Committee on May 7, 2024 at 6:30PM in person. The following members and visitors present:

Generator

Administrator Burton reported on two quotes he received to provide the transfer switch and pad for the Village hall to connect a generator to the Village Building. The quotes were as follows:

Great Lakes Electric - \$ 42,975.00
Generator Systems - \$ 75,800.00

Burton stated the material is basically the same, and he is unsure why there is a significant difference in price. The quote provided does not include a generator. Once the connection is in place the Village will be able to apply for a grant for the generator.

Mr. Cassidy asked if there were grants available for the transfer switch and the pad. Chief Hintz and Burton both stated no. We have to provide our own infrastructure, FEMA or other grants provide the generator. We could even apply for a grant as an emergency shelter. That grant would cover the generator and possibly update the kitchen and stock it.

Cassidy asked where and if we had the funding. Burton stated this is the buildings electrical infrastructure and stated we would use the electric fund to add this upgrade. Cassidy state he did not have a problem with using funding from the electric.

Cassidy also stated he is curious as the difference between the two quotes. He asked Burton to speak with either the companies or someone with a more technical understanding of the items quoted. The committee as whole would like clarification on the difference.

Burton stated there was an accident out at the sewer plant last week. He notified the Mayor and Mrs. Carter. All appropriate steps were taken. It was a no-fault accident caused by strong winds. The insurance company was contacted and they sent an adjuster. Rebekah Fearing read the report from the company. A decision to keep the damaged truck or turn it in was discussed. The insurance company will issue a check for \$ 20,425.00 if the Village keeps the vehicle. If we decided to turn it in to the insurance company they will issue a check for \$24,425.00.

Burton was asked the cost of a new truck. He stated he obtained two quotes. They were as follows:

Sharpnack Chevy –

- 2024 Chevy Silverado 1500 regular cab, long box, WT 4WD \$ 42,619.00
- Not through state purchasing
- Location - Willard

Ricart –

- 2024 Chevy Silverado 1500 regular cab, long box, 4WD, WT \$ 43,707.00
- Through state purchasing
- Location - Dublin

Burton stated he is looking at a 1500 instead of a ¾ ton. He stated he currently does not have a plow and sees no need for a bigger truck and no plow. The 1500 would do the job.

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The committee members recommended to turn the vehicle over to the insurance company.

Mr. Cassidy asked where the funding would be coming from. The Fiscal Officer stated in the past the Administrator's vehicle would come out of the electric fund.

The Fiscal Officer is to ask the Solicitor about how to proceed if we choose to purchase and the dealer is not part of state purchasing.
